## SUSTAINABLE MICHIGAN

**Glen S. LeRoy, FAIA, FAICP,  
College of Architecture and Design  
Lawrence Technological University**

Glen has been a distinguished keynote speaker throughout the country. His presentation will explore how a proactive response to climate change may better position Michigan for sustainable economic development over the next several decades. Glen has been Dean of the College of Architecture and Design (COAD) at Lawrence Technological University (LTU) since July, 2005. Before joining LTU, Dean LeRoy was a principal of Gould Evans Associates in Kansas City. The firm also has offices in Arizona, California, Kansas, Florida, and Utah. From 1980 to 2002, he taught at the School of Architecture and Urban Design at the University of Kansas, and led the Kansas City Urban Design program from 1987 to 2002. He has also served as an adjunct professor and advisor to the University of Missouri-Kansas City's program in architecture and urban planning. He was the 1986 president of the American Planning Association, Kansas City Section, and was later elected president of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) Kansas City.
