He is a past president of the New York Chapter of the American Institute of Architects and is a director of the New York Building Congress as well as the New York Foundation for Architecture. He is a member of the Architectural League of New York, the Municipal Art Society, and the New York Building Congress (2002 – present), where he has served as a director. He recently received the AIA New York State’s Del Guardio Award for Service and the NY Chapters’s President’s Award.
